Western Arkansas Ballet was founded July 23, 1979, as the Fort Smith Civic Ballet and reorganized in August 1985 under the present logo and code of ethics. For over three decades, the Board of Directors has introduced and implemented outreach and educational programs to fulfill the mission of Western Arkansas Ballet. The Board of Directors is proud of the unique characteristics that Western Arkansas Ballet brings to the Fort Smith area: it is the only dance organization with membership in Regional Dance America; the only dance organization to receive annual support from the Arkansas Arts Council; and the only nonprofit dance academy and regional company. The Academy of Western Arkansas Ballet offers classes for company and non-company members in ballet, pointe, tap, jazz, modern, hip-hop, Progressing Ballet Technique, Adult Ballet, and Creative Movement at the Western Arkansas Ballet studios in Fort Smith.

As a part of its mission to bring quality dance education to the community, Western Arkansas Ballet has developed and implemented many community outreach programs where our instructors teach classes for the Fort Smith Girls, Inc. Summer Program and to children and adults with developmental and related disabilities at Bost, Inc.



Act II

Back in Neverland, Tiger Lily, along with the Neverland Tribe, keep a look out for Captain Hook and the Pirates. From the trees, Hook and the Pirate Officers come to capture Tiger Lily. Peter Pan watches and tricks Hook and the Pirates away from her with a ghostly dance.

Peter's adventure continues in the Lost Boys' underground home where Wendy is trying to teach them some much needed manners. The boys are put to bed and Wendy gives Peter his medicine. The two are momentarily enchanted with each other, but Peter returns to his defiant self and abandons Wendy for his bed. Hook and the Pirates sneak down to pull the boys and Wendy up from the underground home, taking them to the Jolly Roger. Hook poisons Peter's medicine. Tinker Bell awakens Peter to go rescue the Lost Boys and Wendy. As Peter prepares to rescue them all, Tinker Bell prevents him from drinking his medicine by drinking it herself. She begins to die and Peter asks everyone to believe in fairies and clap their hands to save her life. Tinker Bell rallies and they fly off to find Wendy and the Lost Boys. Peter flies onto the Jolly Roger and a swashbuckling swordfight begins. Peter is triumphant, forcing Hook to jump overboard, right into the jaws of the crocodile

Back at No. 14. The children's room is still. The children arrive safely back in their room and quickly lay down as if they never left. Mr. and Mrs. Darling, Nana and Liza are all in their beds. They hear a sound upstairs and go to investigate. They come into the room to find the children asleep in their beds. All is well. Once they leave, Peter Pan flies in to say goodbye to the children but especially to Wendy. Peter then leaves to return to Neverland, staying true to his motto, 'Never Grow Up.' Leaving the children to sleep and dream about a time they will never forget.

The air is different this evening in the nursery at No. 14. While straightening up her children's room, Mrs. Darling suddenly senses something strange but familiar enter, something reminiscent from her childhood. The ruckus of John and Michael Darling entering the room scares it away, leaving its shadow behind. As the boys play, their sister Wendy comes in with their maid, Liza, and the nanny, Nana the dog. Even Nana smells something different in the nursery but cannot quite find it. The children are playing together. Wendy gets trapped on the bed when Mr. Darling catches them. He is a stern father who does not quite understand why his family has a dog for a nanny. Nonetheless, he and Mrs. Darling are off for an evening out, just as soon as the children are put to bed.

The still quiet of the nursery quickly turns to excitement as Tinker Bell begins to flit around the room. Peter Pan boldly flies into the room in search of his shadow. While struggling to catch his shadow, Wendy awakens and cleverly helps Peter sew his shadow back on. Showing off, Peter flies around the room, waking John and Michael, who want to fly like Peter. Peter teaches Wendy, Michael, and John to fly and off they go, into the night.

"Second star to the right and straight on til morning" leads the flying children to Neverland. Once there, the Lost Boys are galloping around the island looking for Peter. The Pirates and Captain Hook are looking for the Lost Boys. Tinker Bell gathers the Lost Boys and spitefully tells them that Peter has brought some prey to shoot. One of the Lost Boys, Tootles, fires his slingshot, and Wendy falls from the sky. Peter, John, and Michael arrive and the Lost Boys realize that Tinker Bell tricked them into shooting Wendy. Wendy revives and Peter leads them off to the Mermaid's Lagoon.

There, the Lavender Mermaids are sunning themselves as the Golden Mermaid and Teal Mermaids dance in the sun. Peter and The Darlings arrive to play with their kite. Hook and the Pirates arrive and a fight ensues! Hook slashes Peter in the fight before being chased away by the Crocodile. Their departure leaves Peter and Wendy alone on Marooner's Rock as the waters begin to rise. Wendy grabs the tail of the kite to fly away, abandoning a wounded and dying Peter, until the Neverbirds come and save him and he sails away to the next adventure.
